Intent to Apply to the New Kent Early College Academy

How Do I Qualify For the New Kent Early College Academy?

- Must be current sophomores (rising juniors). Interested rising Sophomores should also formalize their intent to apply by submitting an intent to apply form to School Counseling. Students will then plan for applying the following year and will work with his/her counselor to discuss course sequences.
- Must be able to attend the SDV 100 (College Success Skills) and ITE 119 (Information Literacy) at RCC during the summer prior to the Junior year.
- Completed Algebra II or higher, Chemistry, and AP Human Geography by the end of their sophomore year.
- Should complete at least year three of a foreign language by the end of their sophomore year.
- Recommend good academic standing as defined as an “A” average or better (3.5 cumulative unweighted GPA). Students with a “B” average (3.0 unweighted GPA) will be considered. Students must maintain a 3.0 at RCC and NKHS.
- Be pursuing an Advanced Studies Diploma.
- Must be on track to have earned 5 verified credits by the end of sophomore year (transfer students will be evaluated independently by school counselor).
- Have excellent school attendance.
- Complete the application (to include, the application form, RCC dual enrollment pink form, by the deadline (per RCC requirement).
- Take the Virginia Placement Test at your high school (VPT) and receive qualifying scores, or submit qualifying SAT/ACT/PSAT scores for review to your high school counselor. Students who have a qualifying SAT/PSAT or ACT score will be notified to continue with the application. Those who do not have qualifying scores, will be given the VPT to determine college readiness.
- Upon admission, pay tuition and fees to your high school by the deadline. You will be notified by Mrs. Spiak as to due dates for payment via Schoology message.

Application Timeline:

October 27: Attend Student Interest Meeting (during IE)

November 8: Attend Parent Information Night (6:30-8:30 PM, NKHS Media Ctr.)

December 14: Completed Intent Form due to School Counseling Office

November-December: Be sure that your requested courses for the following year are in alignment with your pathway progression

May: Message your school counselor in Schoology to inquire if you were placed into your requested courses. It is your role to ensure that you take the courses advised.

Description of the New Kent Early College Academy:

A Pathway to the Associate of Arts and Science Transfer Degree

The New Kent Early College Academy allows New Kent High School students to earn an Associates of Arts and Sciences Transfer degree from Rappahannock Community College while still enrolled in high school. The program is designed for high school juniors and seniors who desire a more rigorous academic program and who are highly motivated to complete the requirements for both the high school Advanced Studies Diploma and the A.A. & S. Transfer Degree. The Early College program includes a combination of Advanced Placement and Dual-Enrollment courses, with some course flexibility for students. Successful completion of the program requires necessary course grades in dual enrollment courses and scores on AP Exams of 3 or higher, summer classes at RCC to complete necessary courses, minimum scores on the VPT or other assessment to enroll in dual enrollment classes at NKHS and RCC, and thoughtful early course planning.

The Associate of Arts and Sciences degree in General Studies is a flexible program for those who wish to transfer to a four-year college or university. The Early College curriculum includes a distribution of general education courses which are usually required in the first two years of many baccalaureate programs.

Students successfully completing all course requirements will be awarded the Associate of Arts and Sciences in General Studies from RCC. Although earning an associate degree does not always guarantee junior status at a four-year college or university, Early College graduates may be prepared to enter as third-year students at many four-year colleges or universities. Early College students are strongly urged to acquaint themselves with the requirements of the college or university to which transfer is contemplated and to consult with an advisor at the four-year institution for further transfer assistance. Completion of the A.A. & S. degree with a minimum required GPA may also give students access to the Virginia Community College System's Guaranteed Transfer Program to Virginia colleges and universities.

Because most of the required courses are taught at New Kent High School, for most required courses students and families would only have to pay for the cost of related Advanced Placement Exams and tuition of \$10 per credit for dual-enrollment courses (subject to change). The current cost of the program for families, subject to change, is approximately \$1600 for two years (61 credits) of college work. There are also summer classes to take that are required for all RCC students. Depending upon their schedule and progress students may also need to take courses in the evening at RCC – New Kent Site or Glens Campus to earn college credits from RCC to earn the A.A.S degree. An RCC advisor will be assigned to the student in order to assist with course selection.

Program Goals

1. Introduce students to the experience of college studies in a supportive environment.
2. Encourage high school students to attend college by creating a seamless transition from high school to college.
3. Provide an opportunity for high school students to earn an Associate of Arts and Sciences Transfer degree, at low cost.

Notes:

- **RCC graduation for those meeting all requirements will likely be the summer after high school graduation, due to awaiting final word on qualifying AP scores from senior year. In addition, some students may need to take remaining coursework that summer.**
- **There are some options and flexibility available with this pathway that can be discussed during the advising session thus the reason for the varying credits shown above.**
- DE Introduction to Theater is an optional three credit elective.
- Approved RCC electives can be taken online or in person during any semester (summer, fall, or spring) in the junior or senior year.
- A sophomore can take AP Human Geography and with a 3 or higher on the AP test receive 3 college credits and satisfy a transfer social science requirement.
- In order to receive the 3 or 6 credits for an Advance Placement Course, the student must receive a 3 or better on the AP end of year exam.
- The above curriculum is for the class of 2021 and subject to change as circumstances warrant.
- Students will need to have taken Algebra 2 and Chemistry prior to their 11th grade year.

The Early College Academy program is evidence that RCC and our public school district are working together to respond to Virginia House Bill 1184 and satisfy the requirements of Virginia Code section 22.1-254.13:1. HB 1184 requires local school boards and community colleges to develop agreements allowing high school students to complete an associate's degree or a one-year Uniform Certificate of General Studies from a community college concurrent with a high school diploma.
