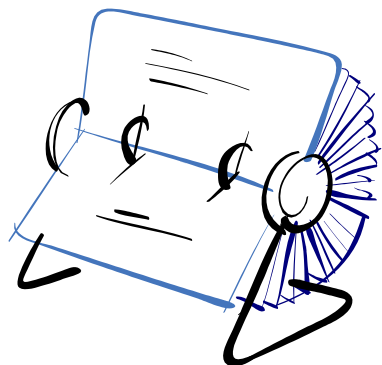

What is “age of majority” and what happens at that age?



When should Transition Planning start?

Transition planning should begin in 6th grade or by 14 years of age.

Who participates in Transition Planning?

- Student
- Parent/Guardian
- Case Manager
- Teachers and other school personnel
- Community and adult service agency representatives (if applicable)



As parents, you will be notified one year prior to the student reaching age of majority. At that time, you will be informed of the rights that will transfer to your child.

When a student reaches age of majority, he or she gains the legal power to make key decisions about school services.
